

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New Extension for Callystown NS



The Department of Education and Skills has granted funding for the provision of an additional classroom to the school. The extension is due to an increase in enrolment over the last number of years and will mean that there will be 13 classrooms in the school when it is completed. The new classroom will be built to adjoin the staffroom and a new corridor will be needed to connect the new build with the existing school. Frank McGahan Architects, have been employed to design and oversee the project. It is hoped that the building will be ready for construction before the end of this school year and that most of the disruption will take place over the summer holidays.

Parents' Council Present 25 Chromebooks

The school has gratefully received 25 new chromebooks from the Parents' Council. The chromebooks are a very versatile IT device as they offer keyboard skills as well as access to apps, internet and educational software. The additional 25 machines will allow greater numbers of pupils to engage with technology throughout the school. The Parents' Council has been fundraising over the last number of years and it is great to see the fruits of its hardwork making a difference to the education of our pupils.

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Reading Survey Results



The school is reviewing reading and comprehension in middle and senior classes as part of its School Improvement Plan. A survey was sent out to parents earlier in the school year looking for information that would help the school to make decisions about future developments. 99 parents returned the survey and the following are a number of the results:

• 86% of parents thought their children were good readers • 76% of parents said that their children read at home for pleasure • 4% Did not read at home

for pleasure • 81% of parents reported that IT was affecting their child's reading time at home • 93% of parents talked to their children about what they are reading • 93% of parents expressed a positive comment about their child's reading fluency and expression. • 27% of parents said their child worried a little about reading while 4% said they worried a lot. • 80% of parents said their child enjoyed reading • 96% of parents said that their child receives good support with reading at school • 47% of parents reported that they were unsure of the meaning of their children's Micra T score.
