First I would fly to Disneyland with my family.... 	<p><u>Time-Reading TV Listings</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Have a look at the TV guide in a newspaper or on your TV and find out what time some of your favourite programmes are shown at. Look at the sample TV guide attached and answer these questions: What times is the News shown at on Channel 1? What programme is shown at 11:00 on Channel 1? What time does Pokémon start at? Which channel is it on? What programme is on two hours after Power Rangers on Channel 2? What programme is shown before Danger Mouse on Channel 1? If the News at 12:00 lasts for 15 minutes, what time will it be over at? 	<p><u>Geography</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Record the weather each day from Monday to Friday by drawing and writing about it. At the end of the week have a look at your weather diary and answer the following questions: How many days were sunny? How many days were cloudy? How many rainy days were there? etc. Which type of weather occurred the most?
