## Library Book activities

- Below you will find the six jobs (There is one extra if you're only starting your book) which you will try to complete throughout your reading. Choose one job to do after each time you read!


## Job descriptions
















Make some predictions of what you think the story will be about/what type of story it will be based on only the cover, the blurb (description on the back of the book) or any pictures on the cover! Your predictions can be represented by pictures, words etc.



Discussion Director: It is your job to come up with questions based on what you have read. It could be about a character, something which happened, who your favourite character is or what your favourite scene is etc. There will be sample question starters below in the printable sheets. Use these to ask yourself some questions or try and come up with your own.




Artistic Artist: It is your job to pick an important moment from your reading and visualise it. You'll have to illustrate (Draw a picture) of this moment and come up with a caption (description of your picture)



Creative Connector: It is your job to try and make a connection to the story. You will do this by relating the story to something else. This could be done 3 different ways. Text to Text (Connecting the story to something which you have read in another story or TV programme etc). Text to Self (Connecting the story to something which has happened to you). Text to world (Connecting the story to something which has happened or is happening somewhere in the world)



Word Wizard: It is your job to choose two words from your reading and look up their definition. You can use a dictionary or if you don't have a dictionary you can use Dictionary.com. After you've found the definition record it and try and put the words into a sentence. Choose one of the words and illustrate word!



Passage Predictor: It is your job to try and make predictions about what you think will happen next in the story based on what you've read so far. This job is done during your reading. When you reach an interesting or important part of the story try to pause your reading and make a prediction about what will happen next. Try to do this twice during your reading and draw a picture to represent your prediction as well. Make sure to check back and see does your prediction come true.



Super Summariser: It is your job to summarise what you have read today. Pick out some of the key moments in what you read. Put them in the correct order and pick out 5 key moments. Right down the characters and the settings which were in these key moments.
